**Description/Remarks**

This is a 2-story single-family residence in the Folk/Traditional style built ca. 1885. The structural system is frame. Exterior walls are historic stucco. Stucco was likely added over wood clapboard siding in the early 20th century. The building has a medium front gable roof clad in replacement asphalt shingles. There is one rear, straddle ridge, brick chimney. Windows are historic wood, 1/1 double-hung sashes. There is a single-story, full-width partially enclosed characterized by a hip roof clad in asphalt shingles with square stuccoed posts. All but the entry bay of the porch is enclosed. Single entry door with transom window above. There is a 1.5 story, rear, frame/stucco addition. Triangular window in front gable. One-story bay on north.
