Description/Remarks

This is a 1-story single-family residence in the Prairie School style built in 1922. The structural system is balloon frame. Exterior walls are modern vinyl siding. The building has a hip roof clad in replacement asphalt shingles. Windows are , 5-light double-hung sashes. There is a single-story, full-width enclosed porch characterized by a hip roof clad in asphalt shingles with square posts. Casement porch windows. Arched openings with arched windows. Enclosed historically. There is a second floor, rear, frame addition. One-story house with 2nd-story addition on rear. Metal porch railings. Asphalt siding on dormer.
