**Description/Remarks**

This is a 2-story single-family residence in the Folk/Traditional style built ca. 1896. The structural system is box frame. The foundation is concrete block. Exterior walls are modern vinyl siding. The building has a gable roof clad in replacement asphalt shingles. There is one center, straddle ridge, brick chimney. Windows are replacement vinyl, 1/1 double-hung sashes. There is a single-story, full-width open porch characterized by a hip roof clad in asphalt shingles with square wood posts. Porch was constructed in 1924. Double bays on south elevation.
