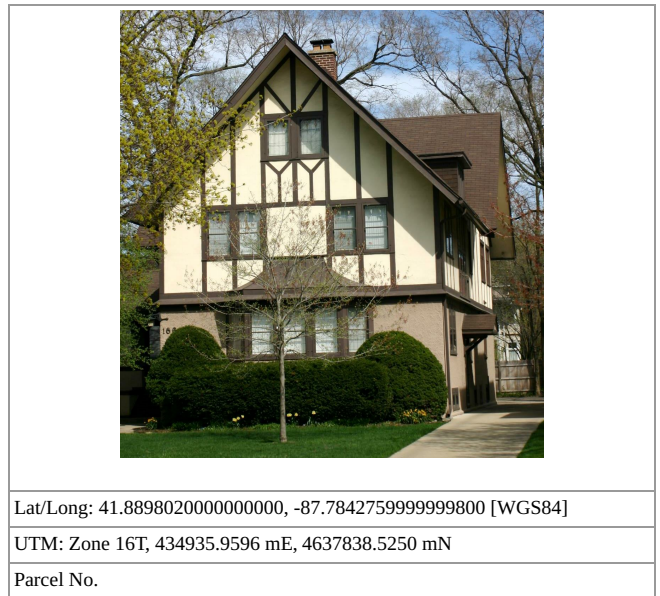

Description/Remarks

This is a 2.5-story single-family residence in the Tudor Revival style with Prairie School influences built in 1912. The structural system is frame. The foundation is poured concrete. Exterior walls are original stucco. The building has a cross gable roof clad in replacement asphalt shingles. Windows are original stained glass casements. There is a single-story, side enclosed porch characterized by a gabled roof clad in asphalt shingles on rectangular stuccoed piers. The house has a side porch with stuccoed square columns and a solid railing. There is half-timbering in the gable field. The facade as a bay window with a metal roof and stained glass windows. The gable has paired stained glass windows.
