Description/Remarks

This is a 1.5-story single-family residence in the Craftsman style built ca. 1914. The structural system is frame/stucco. The foundation is parged with stucco to the ground. Exterior walls are original stucco. The building has a high side gable roof clad in replacement asphalt shingles and two gabled dormers. Front and rear gabled dormers centered on roof slope. There is one rear, rear slope, brick chimney. Windows are replacement vinyl, 1/1 double-hung sashes. There is a platform/stoop. Single entry door with flanking sidelights face onto wood deck with wood railings and stairs; no roof. First-floor single-story bays on north and south. Front roof slopes down over the front porch.
