**Description/Remarks**

This is a 2-story single-family residence in the Queen Anne style built ca. 1896. The structural system is box frame. The foundation is stone. Exterior walls are replacement wood clapboard. The building has a gable roof clad in replacement asphalt shingles and one hip-roofed dormer. Windows are replacement vinyl, 1/1 double-hung sashes. There is a single-story, partial-width open porch characterized by a hip roof clad in asphalt shingles with modern decorative metal posts on side walls wood clapboard piers. The front porch railings and supports are not original.
